YANDINA VILLAGE STREETScape WORKS

PREVIOUS COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:

Council invited the community to provide their input into the preliminary Yandina Village Streetscape proposals at a workshop held on 26 July 2017 at the Yandina Baptist Church, Low Street.

Council would like to thank everyone who attended for your contribution at the meeting, which was informative and provided a clear direction for the project. This valuable feedback has been considered further in the design solutions for the streetscape ready for our next community engagement meeting scheduled for 31st August 2017 at the Yandina Baptist Church.

- Provide crossing on north side of Low St
- Provide entry statement at lights near skate park and start slowing traffic from here (North)
- Community to lobby government for speed reductions & traffic policing
- Improve entry signage
- Safety issue - Cars turning right across solid white line into medical facility / chemist / café
- Plans on empty shop windows prior to meetings
- Possible u-turn at traffic lights
- No further works around Bakery to Stevens St
- Provide kerb and channeling
- Improve safety of crossing from butcher to bakery

WHAT YOU TOLD US:

STEVENS STREET

- Do not one way Stevens Street = 70-80% against
- Consider angle parking on Stevens St
- Keep parking in front of shops
- Provide quick stop parking with landscaping
- More trees and landscaping in Stevens St
- Provide additional parking spots on Railway St land (owned by Queensland Rail)

FARRELL STREET

- Do not block off right turn into post office car park
- No loss of car parking and truck parking
- Start slowing traffic between North and Railway St
- Slow speed through town to 40-50 km/h
- Provide platform humps to slow speed
- Improve pedestrian access - linking nodes, stores, markets, particularly Crossing Farrell St
- Provide pedestrian refuge across Farrell St near Low St
- Provide 20km shared zone across Low St
- Trucks park early mornings in front BP, Bakery etc
- Importance of trees in streetscape
- Safety on footpaths & pram ramps

GENERAL

- Desire central car park
- Note that heavy vehicles that go through town that don't need to (Nambour direction)
- More disabled parking
- Better signage to destinations e.g.:
 - Ginger Factory
 - Spirit House
 - Toilets
- Parking enforcement
- Appropriate tree species
- Landscaping needs safety review of shrub height
- Consider business impact during construction

OTHER ISSUES:

- Speed of vehicles from parklands on-ramp into town
- Policing of speed through town
- Consider Sunbus route and user safety
- Rear parking along shops – private insurance issues
- Potential for the parking area leased from Queensland rail to become a short term park for caravans.
